History of Thurgoona A Promise Delivered.

It is now over 30 years that Peter Thomson and Mike Wolveridge world champion golfers were commissioned to design a golf course on vacant grass and tree lined hectares of land. Housing had begun and Real Estate agents were advertising land adjacent to a super golf course and club features.

Fast forward to the year 2002.

The year 2002 I wrote in the March edition the story of the ratification of the amalgamation between the Liverpool Catholic Club and the Thurgoona Golf Club. If you recall the Thurgoona Club was ailing and heavily in debt. The Liverpool Catholic Club announced an extensive update of the clubhouse to be completed by mid-2004. It promised to rebuild the club and provide the community with a facility to be proud of. Well it certainly delivered on that promise. Saturday the 18th September 2004 saw the official opening of the multi-million showpiece investment now renamed the Thurgoona Country Club Resort the then Mayor Cr Arthur Frauenfelder doing the honours. Our new club cost \$6 million to build and equip while another \$4 million was spent on the

adjoining 26 room motel and the tennis courts. The motel was refurbished whilst the tennis courts were all resurfaced. The state of the art complex was fantastic beyond all our expectations of what was proposed in 2002. Little of the old drab club buildings exist today. A welcoming attractive foyer to the bistro, lounges with panoramic views, reception rooms, special poker playing areas adjoining a T A B, golf pro-shop, gymnasium dressing rooms all done out in brilliant and cheerful colours. The membership of the golf club grew from 300 to 1000 now 1500 whilst the social membership skyrocketed. The club employees of which many are locals are a pleasure to meet. The club is dedicated to its role of giving something back to its members and achieves this through friendly staff making all feel welcome with discounted meals. The bistro meals are delicious and the modern function rooms are in demand for social functions. The golf course has currently undergone a revamp which members say is terrific, especially the golden oldies - the Greys who number in excess of 140 members and who play twice a week. The club is a credit to the Liverpool Catholic Club which has demonstrated a massive expression in our rapid expanding Thurgoona community so let's applaud them who kept their promise.

The Murray Grey Veterans Golfers.

The objective of the Murray Grey veteran golfers is to promote and encourage golf and social activities within the group. MGV supports Junior Golf financially, locally and state wide.

Membership is automatic and free to any full golfing member of the Thurgoona Country Club Resort upon reaching the age of 50 for women and 55 for men. We have over 140 playing members.

MGV playing days are Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Competition fees are \$10.00 per game. We organise several away golfing trips each year to various parts of the country. Plus Overseas, including China and New Zealand. In March 2016 a trip to Thailand has been arranged.

WHEN Lorraine Prior's husband Brian passed away five years ago, it was her beloved Thurgoona Murray Grey Veteran Golfers club in which she sought solace.

"I would come to the club feeling sad and lonely, but within minutes I was laughing and feeling good about myself thanks to these wonderful people," Mrs Prior said.

A year later it was Lorraine who was doing the comforting and giving support to club members in their hour of need.

Lorraine is not only a committee member, but the club's welfare officer and now imparts her own take on compassion.

She is very involved with her work for the club, not only visiting club members who are in hospital, but going those extra yards to make sure everyone is cared for.

"I not only visit or phone members or their partners who are in hospital, but also arrange a get well card which is of our own design.

"When a member does pass on, I make contact with the family, organise a bereavement card which is signed by club members, attend the funeral service and organise members to form a guard of honour. There is always something going on to keep me occupied," Mrs Prior said.

"When the club was formed 30 years ago it had 20 members. Today there are over 100. It is a very sociable club.

"Both Brian and I had a great concern for others, and now that I am the club welfare officer, I am able to be more actively involved in not only comforting club members in their hour of need, but I also make certain I introduce myself to new club members and organise one of our yellow and white club shirts for them".

During her spare time, Lorraine house sits, something she and Brian had done since 1997.

"We would house sit all around Australia, but these days I confine myself to Albury-Wodonga."

The Thurgoona Murray Grey Veteran Golfers, as the name suggests, is based at the Thurgoona Country Club Resort and welcomes new members. "It is a socially active club," Lorraine said.

The club's major tournament of the year will be held on November 21 and 22.



One of those young girls was Lindsay Wright who started golf at the age of nine and went on to have a stellar career both as an amateur and a professional. As an amateur she represented Australia in the 2003 team that won the World Cup then turning Pro in 2003 went on to win the Womens New Zealand Open in 2011/12 as well as having lots of top ten finishes in world events.

Thurgoona has developed some very fine golfers, many of them starting off at the Thurgoona Junior clinics.

Penny Graeber who is a teaching professional, has excelled in the position of junior co-ordinator and with the help of other volunteer coaches, runs the junior clinics on Sunday mornings in school terms one to four.

The programme is for juniors up to the age of twelve and teaches them basic golf skills. It is fun based around developing

their balance and coordination. To view kids as young as five swing a tiny club is a sight to behold.

The girls and boys muster on the putting green at 8.30 am. Penny has a quick chat and then it's into their groups for the fun and games. The youngsters rotate between two activities for the session which finishes at 10.30 am. Some kids love driving, others putting. At least they don't lose the golf balls like the members of the Murray Grey Vets do!! The highlight of the morning is a lolly treat however only if they have helped pick up the golf balls!

The Junior Academy is for the older and more advanced kids who play regulated golf competitions and believe me there is an Adam Scott and Lindsay Wright waiting in the wings. Penny also runs this and is delighted with the talent and enthusiasm by all involved. This group meet after school for coaching sessions, girls on Tuesdays and boys on Wednesdays. As well as playing in club competitions these young players often travel away to both junior and senior events throughout the Border region to enhance their golfing skills.

Every school holidays the Thurgoona Murray Grey Veteran Golfers invite the juniors to play with them in an Ambrose team event. It is always a wonderful fun day the juniors interacting and socialising with the senior golfers. The Vets with a membership of 100 plus do a fantastic job helping and supporting the juniors and Penny is extremely grateful for their contribution to our junior clubs.

The Thurgoona Country Club Resort under the guidance of Adam Fitzgerald also provides great support and is very strong in promoting junior golf within the club. They provide equipment and offer financial assistance when required. Penny says golf has a myriad of wonderful qualities. It teaches many life skills, they meet new friends, learn to enjoy the great outdoors and best of all learn a great game to play for life.

"So, it was really pleasing for Council to be able to contribute to the program in a small way and we look forward to many more 'graduates' tapping their way into the world of 21st Century technology."

Jim estimates that he's seen over 180 people come through computer studies at the TCC and about 40 people through his much-loved camera club over the past 8 years.

Dot Clark, a retired worker from 'Reliable Mail', is one of Jim's longest attending students having started in 2011.

"I come to be sociable with everyone – I love the people here. When I first came I didn't know very much but now I can email, improve my photos and I can put music on USBs", Dot explained.

Adam Fitzgerald, manager of the Thurgoona Country Club Resort was delighted to meet one of Jim's appreciative classes.

"From a community aspect, I've definitely seen an increase in the growth of community groups in the area. As a business, we want to do our bit to accommodate community groups and support the growing community organisations in the area", Adam said.

2018 NSW Senior Open Golf

The second annual Lincoln Place NSW Senior Open Golf Championship was held at Thurgoona Country Club Resort Golf Club on the last weekend in October. Players travelled from around the country, and indeed around the world, to come and compete for a \$100,000 prize purse.

Professional golfers who entered included world-renowned champions such as Peter Senior, Peter Lonard, Craig Parry, Peter Fowler, Peter O'Malley, Mike Harwood, Michael Long (the eventual champion), and many more. A field of this quality is rarely assembled in Australian Golf for any event, and this Senior Championship (open to players 50 years of age and older) is quickly becoming a highlight on the Australian golfing calendar.

The golf course – designed by the late Peter Thomson - was presented in impeccable condition by Greens Superintendent, Dean Lewis, and his staff. The players were unanimous in their praise for the layout and its conditioning with a great number of them remarking on how the event was world-class.

Conducted over 54 holes (3 rounds of golf), Day 1 on Friday was full of highlights. Many of these were provided by Australian Tour legend and stalwart, Peter Senior, who fired a scintillating 11 -under par round of 61. This included a miraculous hole-in-one on the 16th which happened to be caught on video by an enthusiastic spectator. In addition to this, Senior holed his second shot on the 8th hole for an eagle, adding to a long list of birdies on the day. The remainder of the field were left wondering if Senior had played a different course, as they battled with the tricky layout.

As the tournament continued into Day 2, the highlights continued to roll on, with Ben Jackson recording an albatross, holing his second shot on the Par 5, 7th hole. Peter Senior, playing in the afternoon groupings, was challenged with windier conditions and recorded an even-par 72 to lead by four shots from Kiwi, Michael Long, who carded a 5- under 67 to be seven under par, and a further shot clear of Mike Harwood on 6 - under.

The final day was full of drama, and some truly world-class golf with Michael Long recording 6 birdies and an eagle to card another 67 and win the event by one shot from Peter Senior. Long's round was outstanding, highlighted by a stretch of eight holes that included five birdies and an eagle to take the lead.

A great crowd of spectators took up the offer of free entry to come and watch these legends of Australian golf, and they were not disappointed. The professionals were generous with their time, interacting with the crowd and contributing to a wonderful atmosphere.

A large continent of volunteers, numbering almost 100, donning bright red shirts (known as the Red Rangers)

were instrumental in the smooth running of the event and are to be highly commended for their contribution to another successful tournament. As Captain of the Golf Club at Thurgoona, I could not be more proud of this outstanding effort and I look forward to working with this great group of people in preparation for next years' event.

After the tournament, player feedback was overwhelmingly positive and the entire field of professionals are already pencilling this event into their schedules for next year. Getting To know You Profile - Mike Warburton

An interview with Barry Young OAM.

Where born?

I was born in a mining town Broken Hill in 1954-that makes me over 60!

Any interesting details about youth, growing up – schooling memories?

Schooling was not my favourite past time and I left when I was 15. I had just taken up golf and thought I would be a better golfer than a scholar.

Growing up what sports did you enjoy?

I enjoyed playing most sports including Tennis, Squash and Football but Golf was my favourite. I was playing "A" grade golf by the time I was 16 and loved the game. History of Thurgoona Our Fantastic Golf Course By Barry Young OAM in conjunction with Jack Cevaal.

It was in the early 1980's when the Albury Wodonga Development Corporation (AWDC) had the vision to plan a golf course on vacant grass and tree lined hectares of land adjoining St Johns Housing Estate at Thurgoona. Housing had begun with display homes by A V Jennings with agents advertising land adjacent to a planned super golf course and club features. Building blocks were available next to what is now the 13th and 14th fairways. Discussions were underway with Thompson and Wolveridge and Associates to design the best golf course between Melbourne and Sydney. Peter Thompson the great Australian Golfer had won five British Opens. The ultimate plan was to design a 27-hole golf course. The golf course architects designed 18 holes-covering 6365m, par 72, rating 74. The AWDC built nine holes and waited the outcome of further developments. The building of the golf course was not without problems. Thompson and Wolveridge had to build the front nine holes above flood level coping with drainage with water from the local paper mills and heavy rain all endeavouring to skip across the Riverina Highway. Considered were the two creeks that ran through the course. Some of the creek holes were built

virtually on the creek banks making it a difficult slicing trap plus penalty or lost ball. function liquor license which was granted but only on Sundays betw 10.00 am to 6.00 pm. Further

Thompson and Wolveridge purposely under-bunkered so as not to tax the fledgling club finances. With the first nine holes popular the existing social club made way for the Thurgoona Golf Club formed in early 1984. The inaugural President was Ken Morgan an Albury chiropractor. The board formed in 1984 immediately set about raising money to build a club house. The club used a caravan and a heavyduty money box for green fees collection - sometimes robbed.

The club sought a tenant, the obvious choice was the Albury Golf Club but the offer was rejected. Several licensed clubs in Albury considered the golf course for their members but also dismissed the idea. The club had a recorded 385 members on the master register, 80% of which were new players. Membership was \$25. A club emblem was designed by the board. The club went it alone starting from a credit balance of \$10,000. With money raised the club house was completed in 1985 and opened by Gordon F. Craig OBE Chairman of the AWDC on Friday 22 March 1985. The building comprised 33 squares and contained an office, kitchen and dining room with views over several holes and toilets and change rooms. Much of the club house construction was done by volunteer labour. The club applied for an annual



granted but only on Sundays between 10.00 am to 6.00 pm. Further consideration were a Motel and Tennis Courts. With money raised the ninehole golf course was extended to 18 holes in 1985. Against opposition the club became affiliated with the NSW Golf Association through the tireless efforts of Club Captain Jack Cevaal, the club's first life member who was there from day one and pivotal in the success of the project which we enjoy today. He is also a Club Champion and was President for four years. Other tireless workers were - Kevin Burns, Bryan Gee, Lew Pellizer, Wayne Clough and Peter Crow to name a few. The opening of the 18th hole and clubhouse was complemented by an attendance of 1000 people, with parachutist and a band. The days golf winner was Joe Amalfi on a play-off from Dave Drury. On the first two-day tournament held the professionals playing rated it a tough course with massive greens and one of the best courses in Australia. They expressed their respect and admiration for the course lay-out with pro Ken Trimble shooting a course record of 68. The first hole-in-one at the club was by David McGrath playing off the par 3 seventh 152 metre hole. The best golfers of that time were; Case Lustic and Mike "Warbo" Warburton who was described in a Border Mail article early in his career "he clouts the ball a mile and consistently drives around 250m. He has adapted well from the sand greens of Broken Hill his former hometown to our grass greens".

Tom Melouray – a left-handed club champion who played both right and left-handed. Also Bob Orman who is still playing now with the Murray Greys. Graham Hulm also still plays. Penny Graeber who held course records at Corowa, Rutherglen and Thurgoona Courses is the current teaching professional and runs the fantastic junior clinics.

In the late 1990's the club was not traveling well, and it was in 2000 that The Liverpool Catholic Club stepped in and saved the Club.
